The University of Pittsburgh will accept a maximum of 60 credits from a community college. All courses transfer as lower level, freshman/sophomore level courses. A grade earned in a class taken at the Butler County Community College will not replace the grade from an equivalent class taken at the University of Pittsburgh.

Students planning to pursue a major offered through any other school at the University of Pittsburgh should consult the “Pitt Connection” for that school’s transfer policies.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

The specific structure of a degree at the College of General Studies varies depending upon the major. However, all students must complete certain course requirements. It is suggested you begin your plan of study by taking courses that complete these requirements. If you should want to take any other courses, verify transferability with your Butler County Community College transfer counselor or a College of General Studies academic advisor. Note: A grade of C or better is required for transfer.
