

## Pre-Pharmacy Requirements

The School of Pharmacy offers a four-year full-time day professional pharmacy program leading to the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree. The program is six years in length and requires two years of pre-professional courses and four years of professional courses.

To apply to transfer to the School of Pharmacy, you must return a completed Supplemental School of Pharmacy Application form no later than January 15 of the year that you desire to enter the school. The form is available at the Office of the Dean, 1104 Salk Hall.

### Pre-Professional Requirements: 62 credits

Applicants for admission to the School of Pharmacy must have successfully completed or be in the process of completing all pre-requisite mathematics and science subjects no later than the spring term of the year of admission. All other pre-professional courses should be completed no later than the first day of the fall term of admission. All courses must be taken for a letter grade.
